


## **Oxford ELLT Stage 4 Spoken Assessment Instructions**

During stage 4 of the exam the candidate has 15 seconds to look at an image and then answer some related questions. You will need to decide which image you would like to use before the speaking interview. Please be mindful that some of the images have similar themes to that of the presentation and writing tasks – you should choose an image that does not relate to these. It is a good idea to have the PowerPoint slide open and ready before the interview so as to not delay or stress during.

Once you move to stage 4, you can share your screen via the green 'Share Screen button':




This will then open to look like this and you can select the desired screen (without having to share your entire desktop) and press share:





It will then open onto this screen; please be aware the PowerPoint will not be on Slideshow mode so you will need to then select this in order to maximise it (make it full screen):



Each slide has 6 related questions which gradually increase in complexity.

- 7. C2 In your culture, are there any specific beliefs or superstitions related to nail care?
